Dear Mums, Dads and Carers,

Please find some information below which will help support your child:

Continue to read with your child talking about the details in the book to ensure their understanding. Help with any homework or spellings that are sent home. Please ensure your child has their homework diary in school every day. These are a great way to communicate on your child's reading progress.

Please make sure your child has their PE kit in school every day (as timetables change with the weather!) and that all items are named. Remember to tie long hair back and remove earrings for PE. This term, our PE lessons are on a **Thursday** and swimming will continue for Group 2 on a **Friday** for the first half term; remember a swimming hat and goggles!

Now that we expect the weather to get warmer it is even more important to make sure your child has a named water bottle in school. Children should also have a sun hat and sun cream if necessary, which they will apply themselves, for those days where learning will take place outside along with break times.
