We are delighted to report that the school has enjoyed another very successful year, where your children have continued to be provided with exciting learning opportunities which are designed not only to help them learn academically but also to grow into responsible and caring citizens. Our thanks are extended to everyone who works in the school, to all the exceptional staff, led

by an outstanding headteacher, and all the volunteers who give so willingly of their time.

This year has seen the continuation of Forest schools which the children enjoy so much, and benefit from greatly. This has now been extended into a lunchtime activity, where children have been provided with the equipment to enable them to build dens and explore the outdoor environment. The support of children's emotional wellbeing is very important at Buxton School and a new development this year has been the appointment of our own Pastoral Teaching Assistant to help with the social development of our youngsters. As part of this focus, some of our Year Six children have been acting as mentors for the younger ones, to help them settle in and find friends and assist with solving playground dilemmas! The success of this project means it will continue into the future.



This year our KS1 and KS2 SATs results (see below) truly reflect the children's desire to do well and the staff's hard work in ensuring they achieve as well as they can.

The Governing Body is there to work with the school to continue to improve, providing strategic management and being a critical friend and supporter to the headteacher and senior staff. The Governors include parent, staff, community, Trust and Local Authority Governor, so all sections of our community is represented. The Governing Body is responsible for the

The Governing Body consists of 12 Governors who work collectively for the good of the school. An important function of the Governing body is to help the school to monitor its activities, to ensure that the school's development plans are being implemented and having the impact that was intended, so that we get value for money. We are also there to consider the

Health and Safety of everyone at the school and currently are considering ideas for making the start and end of the school day safer for the children.

Through the discussion at one of the planning meetings with regard to the growth of the school, it was suggested by one of the Governors that we should try and secure funding

to create an additional class from September 2014, a year earlier than planned. Our Headteacher followed up the idea and consequently we are delighted with the introduction of our seventh class - one for each year group in September 14. The growth of the school and Mrs Buchanan's maternity leave enabled us to appoint two new members of teaching staff to join our excellent team.



The Governing body has two main committees: the Pupil and Curriculum and the Management Committee. As Governors we have different roles and attend training to ensure that we are well informed in order to support the headteacher and staff. Currently the Governors' roles are as follows:

For the past three years we have been part of a Co-operative Trust* with a group of likeminded external partners whose aim is to promote learning and the interests of the family and the wider community.

All teachers work with teacher colleagues within the Trust offering and receiving support. This collaborative approach supports the development and growth of all children in the Aylsham area.

The coming academic year will bring more exciting developments for our school. The new National Curriculum becomes statutory from September and all staff have been working hard planning and preparing for this to ensure that the learning opportunities will be as exciting and innovative as they were this year!



As you will know, the Government have announced that from September 2014 all children in Reception, Year One and Year Two will be offered a free school meal. The catering provision at Buxton School offers choice and flexibility. Your children will be able to make their choices on a weekly basis – it can be a hot dinner, a sandwich, or a



jacket potato – all equally delicious! However, it is important for parents whose children already receive free school meals to continue to register, as this will provide valuable funds for the school in Pupil Premium.
