Homework

Reading: Thank you for your continued support with reading this past term. The class have made excellent progress! Please continue to read with your child at least 3 times a week.

Maths: This term year 4 will take part in the statutory multiplication check. Because of this, practising times tables regularly would be beneficial to help improve recall and speed. Children are expected to complete a page in their times table books as part of their weekly homework.
