This term’s learning

<p>Maths: Problem solving with all four operations; geometry - position and direction; fractions; time.</p>	<p>Guided Reading Class reader – The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark. English: Stories, linked to our class reader. Leaflets and newspaper reports.</p>	<p>RE: Enquiry – How do people decide what is right and wrong? What do religious people believe about God?</p>
<p>Science: Plants. Scientists and inventors.</p>	<p>Geography: Brilliant Britain – London. History: The Great Fire of London.</p>	<p>PSHE: Votes for Schools. Circle Time.</p>
<p>Computing Creating Pictures. Data handling – collecting, sorting and presenting data.</p>	<p>DT/Art: Painting (colour mixing). Printing</p>	<p>PE: Fitness; athletics; striking and fielding games; net and wall games.</p>

The above gives you an outline of what we will be learning across this term. This list is not exhaustive, and learning is adapted to all our children’s abilities and interests.

<p>Belongings – please remember to send your child in with named belongings, including a water bottle for daily use and clothing to suit the weather. Please help them to do this at home and let us know how they are getting on in their reading records. This is a crucial part of their learning – thank you for your continued help with this!</p>
