Things to remember ...

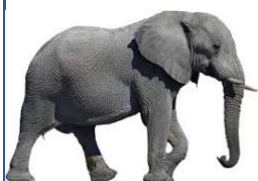

Homework – Homework will be set every **Friday** and should be returned on the following **Wednesday**, ready for marking and re-setting.

- **Maths/times tables** – To prepare them for statutory testing at the end of year 4, please complete one page of their times tables booklet and give them time to practise their fluency on TTRockstars.
- **Reading**- Encourage your child to read at least 3 times per week and complete their reading diaries.
- **Spellings** – Children will continue to learn different spellings each week and have their spelling challenge on Thursday.
