**Our school day:** Gates open at **8:10am**. Afternoon collection time is promptly at **3:05pm**.  
**PE -** PE days continue to be on **Wednesday** and **Thursday**.  
 On Thursday, children are to come into school in their uniform and bring their PE kit to change into in preparation for High School. After May half term, some children will be swimming – you will be notified separately if this applies to your child.  
**Belongings** – Please remind your child to bring in **named** belongings and water bottle every day plus hats and sun cream as we approach nicer weather.  
**Bus/ Walking** – if your child usually travels to and from school on the bus or has permission to walk home, please advise the office as soon as possible if this changes.

Homework will be set every **Friday** and should be returned on the following **Thursday**, ready for marking and re-setting.

- Maths/times tables – Children should know their times tables perfectly, working with inverses, larger numbers and decimals.
- Reading- It is an expectation that your child will read daily – a range of fiction and non-fiction is best. There will also be a comprehension activity set in the lead up to SATs.
- Spellings – Children should continue to practice spellings, especially using Spelling Frame.

SATs and beyond

SATs tests will be taken during the week beginning 11<sup>th</sup> May, from Monday to Thursday. All year 6 children are encouraged to attend the **free** breakfast club at **7:30am** that week to ensure a smooth and timely start to their tests. There will be lots of exciting options such as waffles and pancakes to prepare them well.  
 Once the national SATs tests are over, children will still be expected to produce written pieces of work as part of their Year 6 writing assessments, focusing on end of year expectations in their books.  
 The children will get to explore learning in a variety of ways, especially using our outdoor spaces in the warmer weather.
